

How God Speaks | Stand-Alone Message

This resource can be used to guide your personal anchoring time throughout the week, a small group discussion, or even a one-on-one conversation.

READ

Begin by reading Psalm 19:1-14.

- As you read, underline or highlight the different ways God speaks and makes Himself known to the world that He has created.
- Where in nature do you see the greatness and wonder of God?
- What questions do you have after reading these verses?

REFLECT

Reread Psalm 19:1-14. God speaks in many incredible and awe-inspiring ways. Creation proclaims his greatness. Through Scripture, we have God's very word and instruction to His people and disciples. The Bible is a source of wisdom, encouragement, and rebuke to help us know and understand God more. Then, God speaks to humanity personally through Jesus, who is God incarnate.

- How does creation declare the Glory of God? Where do you experience God's glory in creation?
- Psalm 19:7 declares that Scripture is "refreshing the soul." How has the Bible been refreshing to your soul in this season? What verses from the Bible bring you peace and remind you of God's goodness?
- Psalm 19:10 says that the Lord's commands are sweeter than honey and more precious than gold. How does following the Lord's decrees, bring encouragement to you and those around you?
- What warnings do you find in Scripture? Why do you think God provides these warnings?
- Read Hebrews 1:3. How does knowing Jesus help you know more about God and His character?
- What distractions this week can you turn down so that you can tune in to God through praying and reading Scripture?

PRAY

Begin your time of prayer by reading Psalm 19:14. Read it slowly. Now, use this verse to guide your prayer. To get you started...

FOCUS on the glory of God revealed in creation.

THANK Jesus for speaking to us personally through Jesus.

CONFESS where your words, thoughts, and actions have strayed the wisdom of God.

ASK God to renew your heart and speak truth to your soul through His word.
