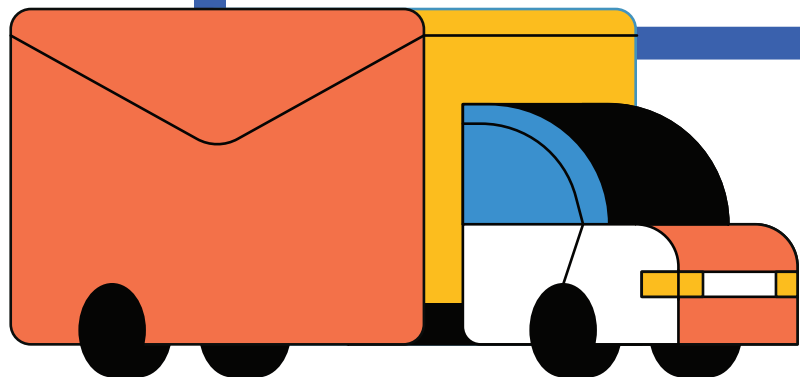
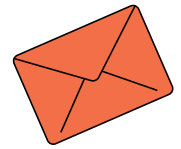
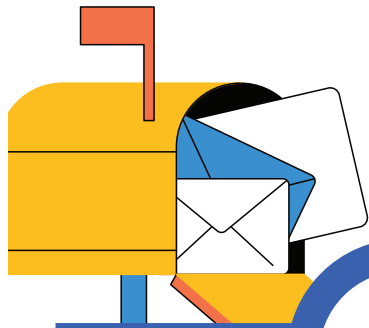
DAY 2

God promises that our gifts will be multiplied when we choose to give with a cheerful heart.

The early church didn't have much. Most of its members were poor. In these verses, what did they do to come up with some extra cash?

They sold some stuff! Then they gave to those in need. They saw a need, they got creative, and they figured out a way to help. They didn't let their lack of money slow them down. They didn't wait for someone else to help. And they didn't hold onto their stuff because they were worried about not having enough. They knew that God would provide for them because of their willingness to give.

Read Proverbs 11:24-25, NIV

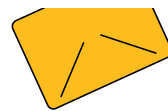
